Protectors

After being awarded another Green Flag award with Distinction over the summer, Planet Protectors have had a busy start to the new school year. Projects for this year include:

Marine - we are planning a river survey and link up with Forest School to extend the river clean ups they do as well as concentrating on reducing single use plastics in school. **Energy** - following the installation of LED lighting over the summer we will be joining Switch Off Fortnight to see how much energy we can save by turning off electrical devices.

Just One Tree Day - we are hosting this for the first time on 13th October. Children can wear their own clothes to school, preferably tree coloured, or dress up as a tree if they want to. Bring £1 in to raise funds to plant trees around the world. <u>https://www.justonetree.life</u>

Cut Your Carbon - takes place next month to raise awareness of ways to cut our carbon use. Look out of details after the 1/2 term break on how you can get involved at home.

Toilet Twinning - following our recycled clothing sale last term we raised enough money to be able to twin both the boys and girls toilets. The Planet Protectors voted to twin the girls toilet with one in Uganda and the boys with one in Nepal.



Our out-going Treasurer, Louise Pickford, updated the committee on the final total of our fundraising efforts for Sept 22 - Jul 23 - a whopping £7512.94! This is a fantastic effort from everyone involved and will be put to very good use.



A huge, heartfelt thank you to Chloe Wallace, who is stepping down as Secretary after 6 years in the role, and to Louise Pickford, who is stepping down as Treasurer after 2 years. We are so grateful for everything you've done for FRS!

Parent Survey

We had a brilliant response to our survey to find out how you wanted us to spend the funds raised. You told us that your priorities for the year (in order) are:

- curriculum enrichment for music/arts/theatre,
- curriculum enrichment for STEM;
- refurbishing the school hall
- classroom/subject resources
- further development of the woodland area and enhancing outdoor spaces
- sports opportunities
- curriculum enrichment for humanities/languages
- IT hardware/infrastructure

Using these results to guide our decision-making, we have increased our annual pledges for STEM week, the whole school theatre trip and classroom budgets; introduced a new annual pledge for a whole school theatre workshop; committed spending from reserves towards a new path down to the woods, and agreed to buy new tricycles for Reception. We will be considering how resources might be used for the school hall at our next meeting in January.
