Chess Club Update

Our Chess Club goes from strength to strength, and they recently took part in a prestigious tournament in Nottingham. Alex, one of our Chess Club leaders, sent this report:

"A really good day yesterday in Nottingham. As anticipated it was a very high standard - we were one of only a handful of state schools to qualify for it, and definitely the smallest school there. The top chess schools from the North were all there - coming from Birmingham, Newcastle, York, Wirral etc. The U9s won three out of their five matches, including against Royal Grammar School Newcastle and Birkenhead School, but two heavy losses against Hallfield School pushed them down the overall standings to finish 11th/14. Just one extra point in



the last match would have put them in the top half. The U11s drew one and lost three matches out of four, but that didn't really tell the story - all the matches were closely contested and two of them were only lost 3-2. They finished 13th/17. The children were fantastic, and I hope they can appreciate what they have achieved in its proper context."


