The early weeks always place extra emphasis on building relationships, and this is especially true in Reception. Our youngest children, just 4 and 5 years old, have now made the exciting step into full-time schooling, supported by their families, our staff and—of course—their Year 6 Buddies.

The Buddy System is a long-established and much-loved part of life at Rainow. Not only does it help our new starters feel safe and supported, it also gives our older children valuable opportunities to practise the skills of mentoring, empathy and being positive role models. A similar system is in place in Year 5, where each child has been paired with a Year 1 Buddy to share reading together.

I am delighted to report that our Reception Class—and indeed all of our children—are settled, happy and thriving! Pupil Voice is also stronger than ever at Rainow. From Buddy Systems to Planet Protectors and our Rainow Reps, children are making sure their voices are heard and their ideas are shaping both school life and the wider world.

To give you a flavour of this, I have included a short message from our Rainow Reps below. You will hear more from all our student groups in the coming weeks. Wishing you all a relaxing and enjoyable

weekend.

"As Reps, we make things happen, like Ridge View for example. Ridge View is a place where you can go to feel calm and re-energised again. It is open every lunchtime. We have completed a number of other projects too, such as the Be Polite Code, the food survey to improve meals, and more. This year we have recruited 7 new reps, ranging from Y4—Y6, which brings our total to 16! Our next project is to create a time capsule for future students to discover. Overall, we are looking to create a safe, calm school environment that everyone
